As the Rim Rolls

Your Bike Club Monthly tip for bike maintenance----Bike Cleaning and Chain cleaning




- Old clothing discards with hemmed edges make great cleaning rags. Especially
 good for those cassettes/cogs and other unusually tight places on the bike drivetrain assembly. Use a quality car wax for the frame. Of course special frame
 materials check your bike warranty and care owner's manual for information.
- <u>NEVER</u>, shoot your garden hose directly to the wheel hubs, headset (top & bottom), crank and bottom bracket area (the main area the crank is attached to) & seat post area when cleaning the bike over-all. Use gentle spray setting on your hose when washing the bike. Hand washing is best extremely dirty bikes, caring for the frame and all parts.
- Old toothbrushes make great tools for cleaning intricate places like derailleur parts such as the pulleys & chains too. Dip the brush in degreaser using minimal amounts. Carefully clean the parts which comprise the movement of the parts together. If you disassemble the parts, make sure you know how those same parts go BACK TOGETHER!
- NEVER, soak your chain in degreaser! Use a commercial grade chain cleaning tool & chain cleaner and follow the recommended directions. Remember the lubricants which come on new chains need to remain intact. The chains pins and links which have to freely move need that factory installed lubricant to remain. Sparse is the key, using only enough cleaner to remove the grit & grime accumulated on the chain.P.S.: Don't forget to re-lubricate the chain after cleaning!
- Special Tip: use Blue Loctite on the pulley screws, if disassembling the derailleur pulleys on the rear derailleur. This provides that extra attention when reassembling. Watch the torque when tightening.
